Mr. Daniel is a digital forensics expert with Envista Forensics in Raleigh, North Carolina. He began performing digital forensics in 2001 and has extensive training, certifications, and experience in cellular networks and wireless technology. He has testified as a computer forensic expert, a cellular phone forensics expert, a GPS forensics expert, and a cellular technology expert more than 50 times in state and federal courts. He authored *Cell Phone Location Evidence for Legal Professionals* (2017) and co-authored *Digital Forensics for Legal Professionals* (2011).

This class will cover methods used by civil and law enforcement examiners to locate persons through the use of historical call details records, precision location data, and E-911 pings. You will learn how cell phones work in wireless networks, and how to obtain and understand call detail records. He will use real case examples to illustrate how location evidence is used and how it can be challenged.
